A Wonderfully Wet Wood

You are just a few steps away from Crinan Wood, part of Scotland's rainforest. Surround yourself with trees cloaked in lichens and liverworts, carpets of mosses, glistening ferns and extraordinary fungi.

Scotland's rainforest is as important as tropical rainforest but even rarer. Made up of native woodlands on our west coast with high levels of rainfall and relatively mild year-round temperatures that create just the right conditions for some of the world's rarest bryophytes and lichens.

Follow the waymarked trail for superb views across the Argyll coastline, west to the Isle of Jura and north to the islands of Scarba, Luing, Seil and Mull.

Get the most from your visit and follow the way marked trail for spectacular views over to the Isle of Jura, discover New York (the ruins of canal builders cottages), explore Scotland's rainforest and return via the Crinan Canal tow path.

Long sections of steep climbing with some rocky steps. Varied surfaces, some narrow, rough and rocky but usually dry.
