Find a shimmering sea of bluebells

During April and May you can find dazzling carpets of scented bluebells in Stubs Wood and Smokes Wood. One of the most iconic sights of spring, they should not be missed. Bluebells have inspired many poets throughout history, including Anne Brontë who wrote:

There is a silent eloquence In every wild bluebell That fills my softened heart with bliss That words could never tell.



Listen for the sounds of spring

Spring is a season full of sound. Listen out for woodpeckers drumming as they make their nesting hollows, birds singing, cuckoos calling, bees buzzing, rustling in the undergrowth or the pitter patter of raindrops.
