







Whinny Hill

Take the high road

Take a walk through the magical Fairy Glen to Whinny Hill where you will find beautiful woodlands, wildflower glades and stunning vantage points over Loch Lomond. Most of the woods in Whinny Hill were planted in the 1960s with a mixture of conifers and native broadleaves. The Woodland Trust has planted 16 hectares of native trees here since 2000.
How many different tree species can you spot?

Whinny Hill Wood covers two hills, Whinny Hill and Knockour Hill. Whin is another name for the shrub gorse which is common here.

Loch Lomond view loop

Walk up through the magical Fairy Glen to reach Whinny Hill Wood. The path then continues to loop through conifers, broadleaves and wildflower glades reaching a stunning viewpoint over Loch Lomond and its islands.

Mainly a wide and firm surfaced path with some grassy segments that can be muddy after rain. The Fairy Glen reaches two gates crossing a quiet public road. There are short fairly steep sections throughout.
