Getting to Langley Vale Wood

We currently have no car park. To reach our nearest entrance, known locally as Sheepwalk, we suggest using these public car parks:

- 7th Furlong car park - 1.6km/approx. 25 minutes on foot;
- Hut and Tattenham Crescent car parks - 2.2km/approx 40. minutes on foot (note these follow an undulating route); or
- Viewpoint car park - 2.4km/approx. 35 minutes on foot.

Tattenham Corner railway station is 2.5 km/approx. 40 minutes walk to the Sheepwalk entrance via Tattenham Corner Road and the brideway.

Although there are a number of public footpaths and public bridleways crossing the Downs, we ask you to follow our recommended routes and be mindful that these areas of Epsom Downs are frequently used to exercise racehorses.

Please be considerate to our neighbours by not parking on private roads or blocking access.
