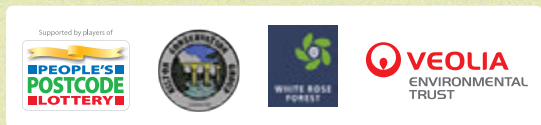

Woodland Walk 2.4km / 1.5 miles | Strenuous | Allow 1 ½ hours

A great walk on the northern side of the woodland taking in the dramatic scenery of the wood and river. Enjoyable at any time of year with fantastic spring and autumn colours.

A variety of paths from the wide surfaced access road to uphill and downhill sections of steps. Some very narrow paths with loose and rocky surfaces especially next to the river. Some sections can get very muddy after wet weather.
