We protect trees in trouble

We restore ancient woodland

Just 2.5% of the UK's ancient woodland remains standing, so we're bringing thousands of hectares of ancient woodland back to life by removing non-native trees, letting the light in, and encouraging plants, animals and native trees to return.

We create thriving woods

We're on our way to establishing 60,000 hectares of healthy native woodland by 2030 and are planting 10 million trees outside of woods – that includes urban greas most in need of trees.
