

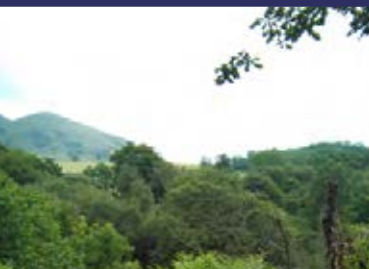
# Keil's Den

'Den' comes from a Scots word meaning 'narrow wooded glen', which perfectly describes Keil's Den. Take a stroll, relax and enjoy the sounds of Keil Burn. Stop and look for wagtails hunting insects around the rocks by the water. Enjoy the carpets of bluebells and wild garlic in spring, and in autumn take in the wonderful display of colour.

Discover this ancient woodland allowing one hour to walk the circular path around the edge of the den or take the middle path crossing the wood for a shorter 40 minute loop.

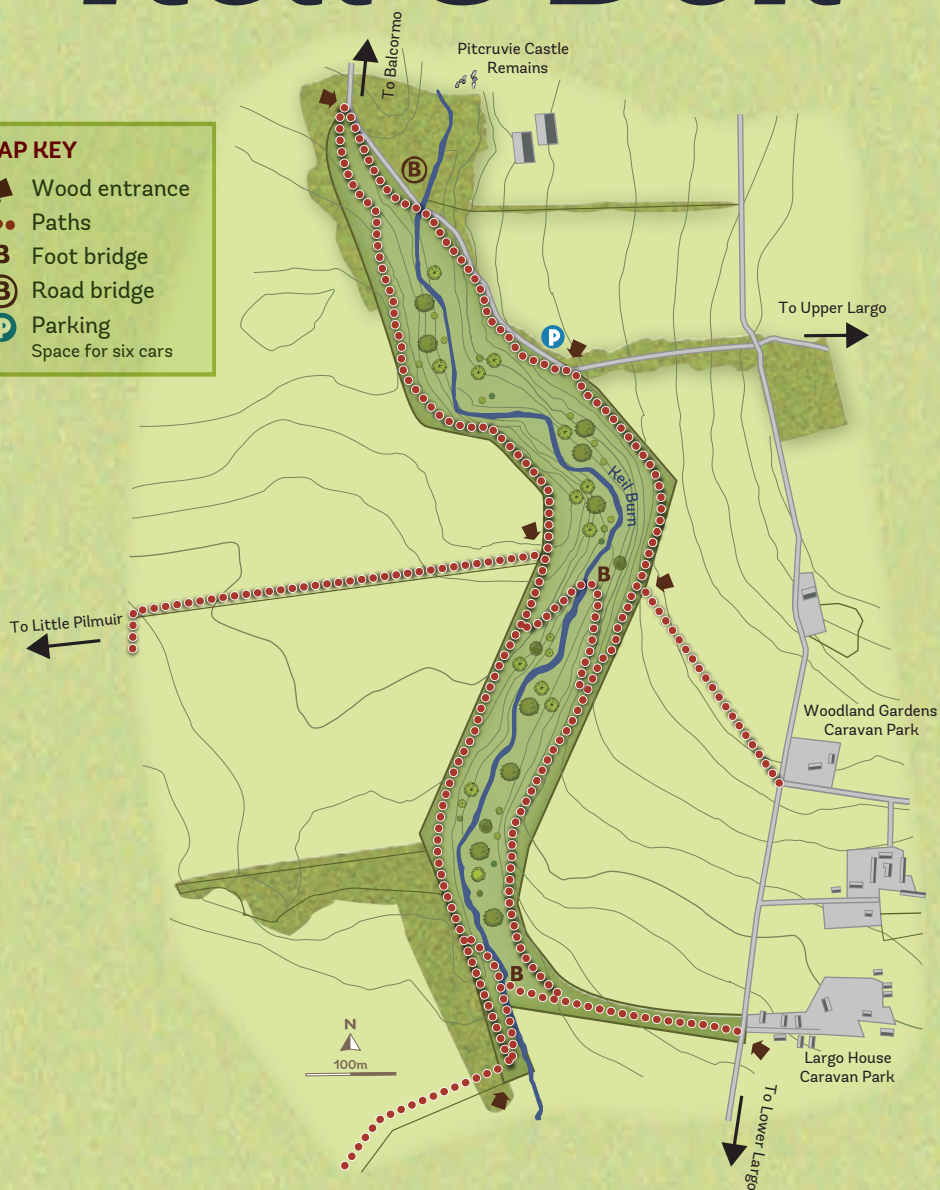
